Glue: To complete the Mala Bead necklace, apply glue to securely fasten the last beads together as the two sides meet. As you thread them back, dip the edge of the thread into the glue. This ensures that the Mala Bead Necklace is securely glued together, providing stability and durability.

Beading Tray: Facilitate the crafting process with ease and organisation.

Candle: Having a dedicated candle specifically for the mala making process adds depth, intentionality, and sacredness to the experience.
